People experiencing homelessness disproportionately experience a high burden of chronic illness, substance use disorders, and mental illness, which hasten the onset of conditions associated with aging. Shelter systems struggle to meet the needs of older

unhoused adults, and existing housing systems are not designed to support individuals who need assistance with activities of daily living or experience cognitive impairment.

Existing community resources for seniors often have age limits that exclude those that

could otherwise benefit based on functional need. The lack of adequate shelter, housing, and supportive services results in continued homelessness, and individuals often cycle through services that are not equipped to address their needs. This webinar will present an overview of factors impacting older adults experiencing homelessness and share strategies to support their housing needs. **Learning Objectives:** 1. Describe unique considerations affecting older adults experiencing homelessness. 2. Identify 2-3 promising practices to support older adults experiencing homelessness as they transition into housing. 3. Discuss 2-3 strategies to address the needs of older adults experiencing




