Mission and Vision

HHRC provides training on housing and treatment models focused on adults, children, and families who are experiencing or at risk of homelessness and have a serious mental illness (SMI) and/or serious emotional disturbance (SED), substance use disorders (SUD), and/or co-occurring disorders (COD). We are a centralized hub of easily accessible, no-cost training for health and housing professionals in evidence-based practices that contributes to housing stability, recovery, and an end to homelessness.

Online Courses

HHRC [online courses](#) are free, self-paced, and cover foundational-level information about evidence-based practices in housing and health. Courses include reflective activities that support trainees in identifying how they will put the training into practice. All courses are accredited for continuing education units (CEUs) through the National Association of Social Workers (NASW).

- Achieving and Maintaining Housing
