NACCHO: Build Capacity in Harm Reductions Communication: Harm Reduction & Academic Detailing (HRAD) Project

With support from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), The National Association of County and City Health officials (NACCHO) is pleased to offer a funding opportunity for health departments or government, nonprofit, academic, or other organizations to develop key messages on harm reduction that can be delivered through academic detailing. Through this project, selected sites will identify and develop/pilot messages for a population that would benefit from detailing on harm reduction and overdose prevention and response and has meaningful engagement with the priority population of people who use drugs.

Through this funding opportunity, NACCHO and CDC will award up to eight (8) applicants, for up to \$60,000 per site.

SAMHSA: Best Practices for Recovery Housing

This <u>document</u> updates SAMHSA's 2018 document and outlines best practices for the implementation and operation of recovery housing. These best practices are intended to serve as a tool for states, governing bodies, providers, recovery house operators, and other interested stakeholders to improve the health of their citizens, reduce incidence of overdose, and promote recovery housing as a key support strategy in achieving and sustaining recovery.

SAMHSA SOAR TA Center: 2023 National SOAR Outcomes

The SOAR TA Center has released the <u>outcomes</u> of SSI/SSDI applications submitted using the <u>SOAR process</u> from 2006 through June 30, 2023. SOAR is a national program designed to increase access to the disability income benefit programs administered by the Social Security Administration (SSA) for eligible adults and children who are experiencing or at risk of homelessness and have a serious mental illness, medical impairment, and/or a co-occurring substance use disorder.

SMI Adviser: Building New Horizons: Opening Career Pathways for Peers with Criminal Justice Backgrounds

This <u>guide</u> is intended for employers that provide behavioral health services, including peer support programs, to hire peers/persons with lived experience of SMI/SUD and legal system involvement. The information contained in the guide is designed for organizations—executive leaders, human resources, clinical staff, peer support staff, and legal teams—to develop recovery-friendly hiring policies and practices to recruit, hire, integrate, and retain peer support workers with a criminal background.
