SAMHSA: Potential Changes to its Evidence-Based Practices Resource Center

SAMHSA seeks input from members of the public on potential changes to its Evidence-Based Practices Resource Center (EBPRC), specifically regarding the possible introduction of three new domains for the EBPRC website. In addition to addressing four general questions about the EBPRC overall, SAMHSA encourages members of the public to comment on several questions pertaining to each of the domains described. SAMHSA believes that public and expert input on the new domains will help make the EBPRC more responsive to the needs of the public and the behavioral health field.

<u>Together TakeMeHome (TTMH)</u> is a national direct-to-consumer HIV self-testing program with a goal of distributing up to one million free HIV self-tests to disproportionately affected populations including gay, bisexual, and other men who have sex with men, particularly Black/African American and Hispanic/Latino gay and bisexual men, Black/African American cisgender women, and transgender women of all races and ethnicities in the next five years.
