Commemorating the 25th Anniversary of Olmstead

This year marks the 25th anniversary of a seminal moment in disability rights history—the Supreme Court’s landmark decision in *Olmstead v. L.C.* —which found that the unjustified segregation of disabled people into institutions constitutes unlawful discrimination under the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) and recognized the right of people with disabilities to receive services in the “most integrated setting appropriate to their needs.”

Last year, the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) announced a [Revitalized Enforcement Initiative](#), strengthening protections against disability discrimination by bolstering enforcement, compliance, policy, technical assistance, and outreach efforts to support community living. A recent [Final Rule](#) issued by HHS in May defined the “most integrated setting” and recognized the many forms of segregation experienced by people with disabilities.

These [FAQs](#) were developed in close collaboration with SAMHSA to provide clarification regarding federal policy on coverage of peer support services outlined in the State Medicaid Director (SMD) letter #07-011 issued on August 15, 2007, which established that states “have the option to offer [p]eer [s]upport services as a component of a comprehensive mental health and substance use service delivery system.”
