# Getting Started with Contingency Management

Contingency management (CM) is an evidencebased treatment approach for multiple substance use disorders that uses incentives to reinforce behaviors related to recovery from substance use. This fact sheet provides an overview of the intervention as well as information about managing a rewards system, measuring success, and funding the program.


## **New Short Video: Introduction to Xylazine**

**Veterans Affairs: Legal Services for Homeless Veterans and Veterans At-Risk for Homelessness (LSV-H) Grant Program** 

The funds are being made available through VA's <u>Legal Services for Veterans Grant Program</u> and are designed to help Veterans in several ways, including:

- Providing Veterans with representation to prevent eviction
- Assisting with court proceedings for child support, custody, or estate planning
- Helping Veterans obtain benefits like disability compensation
- Defending Veterans in criminal cases that can prolong or increase their risk of homelessness, such as outstanding warrants, fines, and driver's license revocation
