Indigenous Peoples' Day

This Indigenous Peoples' Day, HHRC recognizes that American Indians, Alaska Natives, and Indigenous people account for 4% of all people experiencing homelessness and are nearly twice as likely to experience unsheltered homelessness as sheltered homelessness. We encourage housing and healthcare professionals to explore resources, including [HUD's Office of Native American Programs](#), the [National Council for Urban Indian Health](#), and research on [culturally appropriate housing approaches for Native communities](#) to better serve Indigenous populations experiencing homelessness.
